Seven "I AM" Statements of Jesus: A Discussion March 9, 16 & 26, After Worship Services (in Parlor) Questions: Contact Michele Rowell Finn (michfinn@comcast.net)

The Deacons are pleased to host a series of discussions on the seven "I AM" statements of Jesus featured in the Gospel of John. No preparation is necessary on your part to attend these discussions! A guided handout with scripture references will be provided. For each statement, we will review the setting/context in which the statement was made, to whom it was made, what the metaphor implies, its significance, and some tie-ins to other scriptures. Most importantly, we will explore what these statements mean in our continuing relationship with Jesus.

To pique your interest, consider the questions below:

• Did you know that Bethlehem is a Hebrew phrase that means "House of Bread"? What significance might this have given Jesus' place of birth and his "I Am the Bread of Life" statement?

 Can you name which "I Am" statement was made directly and only to a woman? Hint: This woman was gently scolded by Jesus for being impatient when her sister chose to listen to Jesus' teaching rather than help with hosting duties at their home. Yet what does it reveal that Jesus entrusts her with such a profound statement of who he is at such a seemingly devastating moment for her, and her amazing response?
